Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile.

We are made in the image and likeness of God, and how we fall so short of this perfection. It is because of the fall, that we encounter the trials, pains, and torments of evil. The removal of original sin occurs through Baptism, but the struggle and suffering of sin remain our entire life. The degree of sinfulness is attributed to our choices. There is within us an inclination-a disorder to sin. What is this tendency toward sin called? This inclination toward sin and evil is called "concupiscence" (CCC 405, 418). "Baptism confers on its recipient the grace of purification from all sins. But the baptized must

continue to struggle against concupiscence of the flesh and disordered desires." (CCC 2520). How do you overcome concupiscence-the inclination to sin? We battle against Satan, ourselves and society. The ability to overcome-to resist the near occasion of sin- is just that a battle. It is a battle that is won by God's grace. Our choice must be towards the good which is to avoid the near occasion to sin, make sacrifices, be steadfast in prayer, receive the Sacraments worthily, and be immersed in God's word. Let God fill your thoughts, eyes, heart and soul with good things-Godly things! We were made from good-let us seek the good- hear the call of our Father and immerse ourselves in his Everlasting Love.
