### From Fr. Mark

This week marked the beginning of the six-week period known as "Lent," a time when people from many denominations of Christianity observe rituals and traditions focused on penitence. reflection, and prayer. We went out on Wednesday with ash on our foreheads and many of us talked about "giving up for Lent" this year. You may be wondering, "Why do people give things up for Lent? Lent involves three pillars, or three legs on a stool. All are necessary for to be able to sit on it without tipping over. Good practices during Lent is to do something extra in prayer, something involving fasting (whether limiting our intake of food or giving up something non food-related), and something involving almsgiving (giving money or goods to the needy or doing extra acts of charity). People usually give up an indulgence that they enjoy during the season of Lent. Some individuals decide to give up the use of social media, playing video games, or watching less television. The most common sacrifice that is recognized is a person's favorite food to eat. This is an important aspect of Lent because through the deprivation of something that provides us with pleasure we are displaying an ultimate sacrifice to God. Lent is a time for Christians to live out a sacrifice in commemoration of the horrible physical and emotional pain Jesus Christ endured.

Sacrificing during the Lenten season allows individuals to demonstrate a sense of selflessness. This is an important characteristic to embody because Christ was the epitome of selflessness, He died for our sins. Sacrificing allows us to display selflessness because we are doing it for Christ, our goal is to show him the love and respect that he has showered us with over time. Being a selfless individual is acting as Christ would. We are putting ourselves in His shoes by depriving ourselves of an indulgence. Of course, our sacrifice is not as extreme as Christ's, but it helps us realize how he felt, only on a more simplistic level.

If you are planning of "giving something up during Lent" but have not yet decided what that will be, use the following questions to help you.

What is the one thing preventing you from having a better relationship with God?

What is something that is taking WAY to much of your time?

What is one thing that would be really difficult to go without (but your could if your really had to)? What is one spiritual discipline that you were better at?

One thing that I will give up for Lent this year.
